

They also delivered over 10 large boxes of knitted items courtesy of Bonnie Hrusecky. The monetary value was over \$100,000.00.

Planning for the 2024 trip is now underway. We are working with many Churches in the Upper New York Conference to insure that we can once again take two trucks loaded with supplies to the Red Bird Mission in December 2024


Monday Night Dinner:

Dear Neighbor,

I am writing to ask for your financial support of our mission to feed those in need. This past year we have averaged over 270 take out meals to people in our community on a weekly basis. We have delivered over 50 meals to individuals who are homebound, providing a wellness check on them as well.

As we enter 2024, our numbers continue to increase as the need for food never stops. One in eight people in Broome County do not know where their next meal will come from. Our goal is to continue to provide a hot meal to those who need a meal and to expand our delivery of meals to those who are homebound. We also would like to reach out to individuals living in tent cities by the river and rail-road tracks by providing them with a hot meal as well as personal hygiene supplies and can goods.

This vital mission is quite costly to accomplish and we ask that your business consider financially supporting this mission. Your support of or mission to feed those in need is greatly appreciated.
