After much prayer and discernment, your leadership has decided to return to in-person dining beginning September 9th. The new hours will also be:

Everyone will exit the building no later than 5:30pm.

The reason for this change is recognizing that our present model is becoming financially unsustainable. Since the end of Covid, Federal Grants and donations from local businesses has dried up considerably, and the cost of food and take out containers has risen substantially. However, we will continue delivering take out meals to our church members who are shut in, as this continues to be a valuable ministry in staying connected with them.

A letter to all those blessed by this ministry went out on Monday, July 15, when they picked up their meals. This allowed them nearly 2 months to prepare for this change.

While this process is changing, the mission remains the same, which is **to do all the good** we can, by all the means we can, in all the ways we can, in all the places we can, at all the times we can, to all the people we can, as long as we can", John Wesley.

The Lord's Table Monday Night Dinner Ministry is looking for a volunteer(s) to cook on the first Monday of each month. Training, orientation, and support will be provided. Filling this role on the first Monday of each month is vital for this ministry to continue.
