2025 MINISTRY PLAN COMMITMENT LETTER

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is hard to believe that fall is in the air and we are coming into the last 3 months of 2024. We continue to be challenged this year due to inflationary pressures on our operating expenses. As everyone is aware costs have gone up dramatically for everyone including our church. Challenges are nothing new in the history of the church as faithful giving, responsible use of gifts and trying new ideas have ensured the mission of making disciples for Jesus Christ in the World. What an exciting and challenging time, thank you for your faithfulness in our ministry together!

As we look forward to the new year an plans for 2025, we are still challenged by inflationary pressures on our resources. The current plan for 2025 is affected by increases in energy and overall operating costs of the facility. Please pray about your ability to increase your commitment this year as the Ministry Plan costs are projected to grow by 10% or ~\$40,000. As we work to achieve a balanced Ministry Plan for this year and next, if you can help offset the increased costs from inflation it would be a blessing, thank you!

Below is a link for your 2025 Ministry Plan commitment. The process of getting this input from the congregation is critical to planning next year's programs. To be fiscally responsible, we are asking that individuals and families input their commitment electronically to save on mailing/processing costs.
