Committee Reports

Finance – At his request, Facilities Manager, Dave Alexander will not be paid, volunteers would fill in on different tasks. Dave would oversee volunteers. His request was accepted, line A-18 facilities manager will be zeroed out. With the above amendment, the 2025 Ministry Plan was unanimously approved.

The congregation will be briefed regarding the 2024 and 2025 Ministry Plans on Sunday, February 9th by Jim Short.

Trustees – \$15,000 for parsonage repairs, (painting, replacing carpets, new storm doors, and dryer). Ductless units have been maintained throughout the building. \$11,131.24 current balance in the NB Lord's Table fund – DID NOT come from congregation it came from grants and community donations. We are always in need of donations for this vital community mission.

SPRC - Anita welcomed new members and orientation – buddies were matched with staff to support throughout the year. Pastor Mark's vacation schedule, February 3rd-9th, and the last 2 weeks at end of June. Pastor Mark's retirement dinner will be held on June 14th and his final Sunday will be June 15th.

Grove/Missions – Have a budget of \$2000 and a carry over of \$2063. Voted on spending \$50 for cups for Souper Bowl Sunday, \$200 for fellowship coffee, \$800 for National Night Out, \$500 for Rise Against Hunger, \$175 for shipping college boxes. The Spring parking lot sale will be on May 17th.

Children's Ministry – Lois and Jenn report that curriculum and teachers are in place through June. April 12th Breakfast with the Bunny, proceeds to help with VBS which will be held from July 6th-10th and the theme will be, "What A Mess"!

TWIGS Youth Ministry – Aaron reported that they participated with the January Mobile Food Pantry and will also be servers at the upcoming Souper Bowl of Caring, on February 9th. He has launched the Game Changer app to better enhance communication with youth and parents. Youth will also be participating in the May 3rd Raise Against Hunger 20K meal packing event at Holy Family.

Endwell Preschool – Director Beth Strong thanks Dave Alexander for his snow removal/safety efforts this winter and securing the new shed, purchased by MESD. Pastor Mark was a Mystery Reader last week and the children enjoyed having him in to read to them! We will continue this throughout the rest of the school year.
