New Business

SPRC had to make a revision to Pastor Sean's 2026 compensation package at the direction of the district office. The change involved the listing of a parsonage, and his housing allowance. The net effect is about \$492 increase to his package. Joanne Howard moved to accept., Aaron Bennett seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Old Business

Committee Reports

Finance – Through September our income has exceeded our expenses by about \$8500. **Endwell Preschool** They currently have 6 - 2 year olds, 10 - 3 year olds, and 16 in the UPK program. Their poinsettia/wreath fundraiser ends 10/28. They will have a Christmas tree at the Roberson Museum's Home for the holiday event.

Trustees The fellowship Hall floor leaving project will begin on 10/22 -completed on 10/22

SPRC – They are currently meeting with all of the staff members just to see how things are going, report that all is well.

Grove/Mission – Raised about \$1000 at the parking lot sale. Upcoming events include bell ringing for the Salvation Army at Weis Markets, a wisdom exchange, Trunk or Treat, Thanksgiving baskets for our shut-ins, college boxes, and the Christmas Tea on 12/7. Dave estimates that we will run out of funding for the Lord's Table dinners in mid 2026, primarily because of increased expenses obtaining food from the Food Bank of the Southern Tier. Two people are completing required food safety training through the Food Bank.

Children's Ministry – First unit of the year almost complete, with second one starting soon. Attendance is down slightly. They are working on completing Safe Sanctuary training for their teachers and volunteers.

Youth Ministry – Wen on a hike in the IBM Glen. Completed their second Ramp It Up project of the year. Trunk or Treat is 10/31, Planning a progressive dinner on 11/2

Associate Pastor – With Pastor Nancy's help, visitation at all of the nursing homes has been completed, also hospital visitation. Home visits are next on the schedule. The Lao congregation has recently had a new family join.

Lay Leadership: Charge Conference is on November 8th at 11:00am at Vestal UMC

Senior Pastor: The Stewardship Campaign will begin on November 9th. We need to establish an Emergency Plan. We also need to do a membership audit in 2026. Details on the ecumenical Thanksgiving service and Christmas Eve services at Endwell have yet to be determined. All Saints Day is November 2nd. We currently have four saints to be recognized.


Prepare The Way For the Lord:
