During this Advent season, I'd like to share an Advent Hymn with you that I've always liked. The hymn is "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus," (The UM Hymnal, #196). It is a short hymn of only two verses, written by the prolific hymn-writer, Charles Wesley.

Both verses remind us that the blessed Baby grew up to fulfill His mission, but pay close attention with me a particular phrase from verse 2:

"Born, thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a King, born to reign in us forever, now thy gracious kingdom bring. By thine own eternal spirit **rule in all our hearts** alone; by thine all sufficient merit, raise us to thy glorious throne."

Friends, what would it mean if Jesus ruled in all our hearts – **alone?** In other words, what if **only He** was the ruler of our hearts? What a different world this would be! The first part of verse 2 reminds us that Jesus was born to reign in us forever. If He alone rules in our hearts, what implications does that have for this Christmas and for the rest of our lives?

None of us knows what lies ahead in the coming days, weeks, months, or years. However, we have the blessed promise and truth (Truth) of Jesus – Emmanuel – God with us. This is not just a theological concept or a biblical construct, but the reality of our faith.

I wish you a blessed, joyous, and Christ-filled Christmas. May Jesus alone reign and rule in all our hearts. O come let us adore Him, Christ the Lord!
