As we move into the new year, let's think about the word "new." "Newness" is a pervasive theme throughout scripture. Isaiah 43:18-19 tells us "*Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.*" Lamentations 3:22-23 tells us: "*The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning: great is your faithfulness.*" Jeremiah 31:31-34 shows God making a **new** covenant with the people, not written on tablets of stone, but on their hearts. Sunday, January 4 from 3-5 p.m. There will be finger foods, including chocolate, of course. Come when you can, leave when you need to, but please come.



# Church News

## Trustee Year End Report:

The Trustees have been busy this past year making needed repairs to the Church, here is a highlight of some of the various projects that have been accomplished by your Trustees:

Paved the parsonage driveway

Installed all new door in the parsonage

Painted the entire interior of the parsonage

Purchased a new refrigerator and dryer for the parsonage

Purchased a large storage shed to hold overflow items from the fellowship hall

Installed a new fire alarm system and burglar system to replace our outdated system

Installed several cameras around the Church

Installed additional security lighting

Completed new lighting in the sanctuary

Crack sealed the parking lot

Leveled the floor in the fellowship hall by having foam install under it

Installed a new exit door in the Narthex to replace the existing warped door

Painting the office hallway (in progress)

As you can see the Trustee have been busy, many thanks to Tom Scheibner, Ken Anderson and Jim Short for their time on these projects.

## Mobile Food Pantry Year End Report:

Our monthly mobile food pantry served over 3,210 people this past year, giving out over 92,510 pounds of food from the Food Bank of the Southern Tier in Elmira with a value of \$56,275.00. This is a great mission to be involved in and we always welcome new people to help us the first Monday of the month.

## **Monday Night Dinner Year End Report:**

This is our 29th year of feeding people in need of companionship and a warm meal. We are serving a combination of take out and in person meals. We average 40 take out meals and 50 to 60 in person dining. We have formed many friendships with our clients and feel like they are family to us. We are always looking for people with a passion for cooking or serving and welcome anyone to come on join us on a Monday evening.

## **Red Bird Mission Year End Report:**

This past year we faced several stumbling blocks with our mission, first we lost our storage space at NelCorp Electric and ended up using our fellowship hall to store the items that we collected. I must say that this worked out great as it was clean, well lit, and warm to work in. Second, the cost to rent the trucks was going to be over \$3,000.00 for five days, they finally agreed to lower the rate to \$2,000.00 for five days for each truck, that helped us out greatly.

We collected 2,632 shoeboxes of personal hygiene supplies plus sheets, blankets, backpacks, scarfs, hats, pjs, pillows, towels and other misc. items.

Special thanks to Tom Scheibner, Ken Schlock, Jim Short .John Zdimal, Howard and Cheryl Champlain for making the trip to the Red Bird Mission to deliver the supplies.
